Rachel Knight - the Life of a Coroner

Rachel is a criminal barrister who works part-time for both the Crown Prosecution Service and, as an Assistant Coroner, for the Coronial Area of South Wales Central.

Thursday, 14th January at 7pm

Jennifer Phillips - Roath Rules

Henry, Charles and Davy Rule were a trio of seafaring brothers who came to live in Roath in the nineteenth century. This talk will look at their ancestral connection with a village in Pembrokeshire, family adventures at sea (including a connection to the Titanic) and what became of their descendants in Cardiff, among them a patient at Whitchurch Hospital, an eminent neurosurgeon, losses in both World Wars and a continuing family connection with Roath.

Malcolm Ranson - History of Llanederyn

Thursday, 11 March at 7pm

Jeff Childs - Landowners of Roath from the Normans to the twentieth century.

An account of various landowners who have held sway in Roath, whether in a parochial or manorial context, from earliest recorded times. 'The talk will encompass landownership, landed estates and the areas where their principal domains lay. Sources for the study of landownership will also be described.

Thursday, April 8th at 7pm

Ted Richards - Captain George Auger, the Cardiff Giant, the tallest man on earth.

The billboards for the Barnum and Bailey Circus in America in the early 1900s advertised Captain George Auger as the World's Tallest Man. Whether he was or not is open to conjecture but he was certainly up there among the tallest. The talk will trace the life of George Auger from his birth in Cardiff, his upbringing in London and his time in America, finishing with his sad early death just prior to embarking on a career in Hollywood. The talk will also touch on how the research into George Auger was carried out.

Thursday 13th May at 7pm

Dr Andrew Hignell - Early Sport in Cardiff

The talk looks at recreational activity in the vicinity of Kingsway and St. John's Church, before 1875. Also, the development of the Arms Park and the reasons why the Marquess of Bute was keen to promote sporting activity in the heart of the town. References include the playing of fives, handball, bull-baiting, bare-knuckle boxing and cricket.

Tracing and restoring a family war memorial

R.L.H.S. Member **Jeremy Sparkes** unravels a family history trail concerning his great uncle, **2nd Lt Vivian Llewellyn, Royal Welsh Fusiliers**. A working-class lad from Cathays, killed in action just days before the Armistice. Six months later, a costly marble memorial tablet was erected to his memory. *How was it afforded and what happened to it?*

The Incredible Life of Dr William Price

Dean Powell tells the story of Dr Price, one of the most flamboyant and eccentric characters in Welsh history. Chartist, surgeon, heretic, archdruid and pioneer of cremation. An original thinker he created an embryonic national health service, masterminded the first Museum of

Welsh Life, launched Wales's first cooperative society and was exiled to France as a political activist - *all this and more!*
